**Generic measures of ADL**

<u>Barthel</u>	●	●	●	●	Brief; moderate-severe dementia
<u>Katz</u>	●	●	●	●	Brief; moderate-severe dementia
<u>FIM</u>	●	●	●	●	Moderate-severe dementia

●	Sound	Straightforward	< 6 min	Free
●	Acceptable	Complex admin or scoring	6–15 min	One-time/training costs
●	Minimal/unknown	Complex admin and scoring	> 15 min	Charge for each use
